

Readers write: Suffolk Humane Society has Driver office

Suffolk Humane Society will open a temporary office at 3118 Kings Hwy. next to Arthur's General Store in the village of Driver. Volunteers will staff the office Monday through Friday.

The building, severely damaged in the April 2008 tornado, has been repaired and will serve numerous functions for the group. "We will accept donations, store our materials, hold adoption events and humane education presentations/seminars, sponsor the Neuter Scooter, adopt cats, and much more." said Angela Chandler, president of the Suffolk Humane Society board of directors. "Having an official location will give us so many new opportunities."

The group is also seeking donations of office equipment, including a copy machine and fax machine. Donations are tax deductible.

In December, three acres of land on Pruden Boulevard were donated to the society. Chandler said the group hopes to use the land eventually for an office and one day as a possible site to build an environmentally friendly animal shelter in Suffolk. The Suffolk Humane Society is dedicated to promoting the welfare of companion animals in the community through sponsoring spay/neuter programs, placing homeless animals in loving permanent homes, and providing quality humane education with an emphasis on responsible pet ownership.
